General Information

Community Unit School District 220 offers a self-funded K-12 Summer Program. The program is available to any public, private, or parochial student who is a legal resident in District 220. Students who live outside the boundaries of District 220 are also able to take academic courses, if space is available. The program is designed so that students can gain academic credit, receive enrichment, and explore new interests as well as remediate a course, if necessary. In order to meet the criteria for the summer session, students must be eligible for the course during the next regular school year.

General Information

Registration

Starting March 1, 2010, Academic and Camp offerings can be viewed on-line by visiting www.barringtonhighschool.org. Click on the summer school link.

Registration will begin on March 18, 2010 at 7:00 AM. The easiest way to register is online, **be sure to have your parent home access and credit card information ready** before registration begins. You may also register by printing a registration form off the summer school link or picking up a summer school packet at the BHS Guidance Office. Forms will also be available in the main office at Station and Prairie campuses starting on March 1st.

Attendance

• **Only 1 absence will be accepted during each session. Any student who is absent beyond one class period, regardless of the reason, will forfeit the credit and all fees.**

Each day of a summer school course represents approximately one week of the regular school year. Therefore, regular attendance is required. The basic responsibility for attendance lies with the student and parents. Summer vacation plans should not be scheduled during summer school.

Behavior Expectations

Any student that does not follow school rules may be dropped from the summer program. Students should familiarize themselves with the BHS behavior expectations in the Student Handbook. Students not attending BHS during the regular school year are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the Student Handbook and class expectations. No refunds will be given for any course dropped due to attendance or behavior issues.

Summer School Tuition

Once class begins, tuition is non-refundable. CUSD 220 Students eligible for the free/reduced lunch program may have their tuition fees waived. **Full payment must be made upon registration, no partial payments will be accepted.** See registration page for fees.

Refunds and Course Credit

Course credit will only be given for completed summer school courses in which a student earns a passing grade. **If a student chooses to drop a course prior to the first day of classes, half of the tuition fee will be refunded. After June 14, no refunds will be given.**

Final Exams

Attendance is mandatory on the last day of each session. All final exams are scheduled for that day. Finals will not be given early.

Cafeteria

The cafeteria will be open for refreshments each day from 7:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Snack and drink machines are available in the cafeteria and Main Gym lobby.

Textbooks & Supplies

Textbooks will be provided for all students. Students must supply any other materials needed for their particular course.

Class Times

Unless otherwise noted all classes will run from **7:20 AM to 12:00 PM.**

Parking & Student Drop-Off

The student parking off of Hart Rd. will be available to all students with a car.

We ask that all parents dropping off and picking up do so from the Hart Rd. entrance on the west side of the building. Doing so will help reduce traffic and congested areas.

FAQ

Can I change a class?

Changing classes on the first day of each session is strongly discouraged. A \$30.00 course change fee will be added for students who change classes on the day that each session begins. No changes will be made after the first day of each session.

Does the district provide transportation?

Parents/Students are responsible for transportation to and from school. No transportation will be provided.

What determines if a class will be cancelled?

You will be notified if a class is cancelled. It is important to have an alternative plan if a class is cancelled. The district reserves the right to cancel any courses which do not meet enrollment requirements or if unable to secure a certified instructor.

Who do I pay lab fees to?

If your course or camp requires a lab fee, they are to be paid directly to the teacher/coach on the first day.

May I replace a grade?

All grade replacements for students re-taking a class must be within 15 months AND prior to the next course in the sequence within the same discipline. The student must notify the registrar that he/she is replacing a grade.

Can students outside CUSD 220 participate?

Students who live outside of District 220 boundaries are eligible to take academic classes (but not athletic camps) at Barrington High School during the summer session. In order to register, students must be enrolled in high school. If a student is not enrolled in District 220, it is the student's responsibility to fill out a grade transfer request card at the registrar's office so that their grade will be transferred to their school. This must be completed on or before the first day of class.

Students must provide the name of their school and a current school ID number. Please be advised that early registration will not guarantee a seat in an academic class because District 220 students will be given the first chance to enroll for the courses offered. Students who live outside the district will be charged an additional \$50 for any academic course.

What do I need to provide the nurse's office?

Students entering grades 9-12 that were enrolled in a District 220 school during 2009/10 have records on file. If a student was not enrolled in a District 220 school, they will need to fill out a Health Card. Please notify the nurse if your child has an Emergency or Health Plan in place at his/her present school. The summer school nurse will share the health plan with your student's teacher. School Board Policy 7:100 requires the most recent Physical and Immunization record be on file. If you are not enrolled at CUSD 220 please submit these health records with registration. A health form, immunization record and recent physical must be submitted before the 1st day of class or student will not be allowed to attend BHS.

NURSE NOTES:

Does your child have Asthma, Food or Bee Allergy, or other Health Conditions?

- *Please remember that if your child has an Inhaler or Epi-Pen that they carry at school, to notify the Summer School Nurse.*
- *Children prescribed an Inhaler or Epi-Pen should have them available during summer school in case of an emergency.*
- *Appropriate medication forms should be on file.*
- *Students may need an Emergency Care Plan (ECP) developed by the school nurse to be shared with teachers and coaches that have a need to know.*
- *Contact the School Nurse if you have any concerns regarding your child's health status during summer school.*

Can I transfer a grade to another district?

Students from other high schools must request a "gray" form from the registrar on the first day of each session to assure a grade transcript will be sent to their school. It is the students responsibility to pick up and fill out this form. They should notify the school they attend during the regular school year to see if credit is transferable.

How do I know what room the class is in?

Room Assignments will be posted on the BHS website 2 weeks prior to the start of summer school and at the school entrances on the first day of classes.

Can I request a teacher?

There are no teacher requests during summer school, the district is responsible for assigning classes and requests will not be taken.

Academic Courses

Applied Arts

INDEPENDENT LIVING (4635) 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: none

This introductory course fulfills the consumer education requirement for graduation and is designed to prepare students for living on their own. Emphasis will be placed on consumer decision making. Units of study include handling finances, taxation, creating a resume and interviewing for jobs, purchasing foods, caring for clothes, determining insurance needs, housing choices, transportation needs and costs, and consumer services and protection.

INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS (3123) 1/2 Credit

Open to freshmen and sophomores

Prerequisite: none

Introduction to Business is the first course in the business curriculum dealing with the understanding of business practices and procedures that are important to everyone as consumers and business people. The importance of business is stressed in satisfying the wants and needs of consumers. The inter-relationship of business activities and the role of the consumer is emphasized. Successful completion of this course will fulfill the Consumer Education graduation requirement.

VIDEO PRODUCTION (3043) 1/2 Credit

Open to freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: none

This course provides a unique classroom experience where students learn the fundamentals of video production through the creation of a video yearbook. Students will also complete a variety of video productions throughout the course. These projects will include but not be limited to: original programming, sporting events, governmental meetings, concerts, etc. Due to the nature of the course, hours outside of the normal school day will be a requirement. The student will be given an overview of fundamental video production equipment and techniques necessary for success. *All levels are welcome!*

WOOD WORKING I,II, or III (4232) 1/2 Credit

Open to freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: none

These sequential woods courses are designed to teach students skills that include safety around tools and equipment, measurement, hand tool use and identification, wood joints, board foot computation, power tool and machine use, project selection, planning and construction. Student interest projects will be used to gain hands-on experience and allow for the development of creativity. All students will be responsible for the cost of the materials used to build their individual projects. A selection of materials will be provided for students to choose from. A \$20 lab fee is required for each semester. *All levels are welcome!*

English

SOPHOMORE ENGLISH • LITERATURE (2233) 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores

Prerequisite: Freshman English

The literature curriculum for sophomores focuses on adolescents' emerging attempt to articulate images of their experience – both to celebrate the reaches of a broadening awareness and to honor the boundaries of a moral self. Core works that stimulate these reflections include *Catcher in the Rye*, *Ordinary People*, a collection of short stories defining points of departure for a struggling consciousness, and either *Sophocles' Oedipus Rex* or *Antigone*. *House on Mango Street* enlarges the conversation of suburban youth with the experiences of youth in a contrasting ethnic culture. A reading from Holocaust literature – either *Night* or *The Shawl* – stirs reflection about ethical issues in a broader social context. The work with literature concentrates on the ability to explicate individual images embodied in metaphors, similes, and symbols. The work with writing, as well as reading, enables a greater comfort with abstract thought and facilitates alternatives to chronological sequencing in the structuring of the students' ideas. There is a formal study of grammar and rules of usage.

AVAILABLE SESSION 2 ONLY

SOPHOMORE ENGLISH • SPEECH (2234) 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores

Prerequisite: Freshman English

Sophomore Speech is designed to prepare students to meet confidently the oral communication experiences they will encounter in school and work. Students will participate in individual presentations as well as group performances in the areas of public speaking, improvisation and oral interpretation. Students will be evaluated on written tests, outlines, and manuscripts, as well as actual speech performances. They also work with research skills. This is a one-semester course which may be taken either first or second semester. During the alternate semester, the student will be enrolled in Sophomore English 2230, 2231 or 2233.

AVAILABLE SESSION 1 ONLY

SENIOR ENGLISH • FILM CRITICISM (2433) 1/2 Credit

Open to seniors

Prerequisite: Junior English

Studies in Film Criticism extends the critical reading and thinking skills applied to printed texts to the text of film art. The primary goal of the course is to move students from being passive viewers of film as entertainment to being reflective, evaluative moviegoers. In order to cultivate a vocabulary for discussing films critically, attention is paid to editing; visual design; cinematography; styles of directing; and literary elements in filmmaking such as narration, characterization, point of view, and theme. Writing skills that are emphasized include the formulation of a clear and precise thesis; structuring argument and exposition effectively and efficiently; and marshalling evidence to support assertions. Besides critical reviews of individual films, essay assignments call for students to relate films thematically to their personal experience and larger social issues.

Academic Courses

Fine Arts

DRAWING/ PAINTING (1134) 1/2 Credit

Open to freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: sequential

Drawing/Painting is for those students who want to learn or improve their basic drawing/painting skills and their ability to put their own unique ideas down on paper. They will also improve their ability to think and see creatively.

Students will learn to draw portraits, figures, landscapes, and improve their ability to perceive and use color, making painting a natural extension of drawing. They will work with a variety of materials: pencil, pastel, ink, charcoal, conte, craypas and mixed media. The class is designed for all levels of ability and to meet individual differences. Student will progress at his or her own rate. Drawing/Painting I has no prerequisite. Students who wish to explore advanced drawing/painting concepts and techniques may continue through Drawing/Painting II, III, and IV. Evaluation is based on effort and progress. Lab fee: \$25.00. *All levels are welcome!*

AVAILABLE SESSION 1 ONLY

PHOTOGRAPHY (1463) 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: sequential

Creative camerawork with light-sensitive emulsions is at the core of this semester-long course. Students become familiar with the process and aesthetic considerations of the medium, beginning with basic technical instruction and problem-solving methods for black-and-white film photography. Camera operation, film processing, printmaking and presentation are the main areas of concentration. (Students must provide their own film cameras.). Essays and reviews deal with contemporary issues as well as the history of the medium, in addition to work in the darkroom. In successive semesters, students investigate the concept of fine print, experiment with a variety of materials, and employ more extensive manipulation of images. Evaluation is based on effort and progress. Continuing study assumes mastery of tools, materials and processes. Lab fee is \$60.00; additional expenses for film, papers and field trips. *All levels are welcome!*

AVAILABLE SESSION 1 ONLY

PRINTMAKING (1263) 1/2 Credit

Open to freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: sequential

In this course the student explores the unlimited possibilities of creating works of art through the medium of printmaking. The four basic processes to be studied include etching, silkscreen, relief and drypoint with variations and combinations of these processes. A drawing background would be helpful in this class. No prerequisite is required for Printmaking I. In Printmaking II, III and IV more explorative and experimental approaches to the above processes will be stressed. The cost of the graphic materials will be shared with the student according to individual needs and usage. Evaluation is based on effort and progress. Lab fee: \$30.00.. *All levels are welcome!*

AVAILABLE SESSION 2 ONLY

Mathematics

***NOTE: Remediation Only**

***ALGEBRA I-B (6143) 1 Credit**

Open to freshmen and sophomores

Prerequisite: Enrollment in Algebra I-B within 15 months AND prior to the next course in the sequence within the same disciplines

Topics studied include properties of number systems, equations, inequalities, polynomials, algebraic fractions, systems of equations, functions, graphing on the number line and coordinate plane, radical expressions and various application problems. In this course, the structure of mathematics will be stressed. Guidance will be given to students in solving problems and students will also be expected to discover solutions collaboratively. Skill in computing with fractions, decimals, and positive and negative numbers is necessary for this course. Students are required to bring a TI-83 or TI-84 graphing calculator to class on a daily basis.

Algebra I-B is now open to incoming 8th graders, for remediation only. Semester 1 registrants must have taken Algebra 1, part 1 in MS and semester 2 registrants must have taken Algebra 1, part 2 in MS. Registration preferences will first be given to BHS students. **(Incoming freshman would not receive credit for the course, but would be permitted to audit the course.)**

***ALGEBRA II-B (6343) 1 Credit**

Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: Geometry (6243) and enrollment in Algebra II-B within 15 months AND prior to the next course in the sequence within the same discipline.

This course includes an extension of algebraic manipulations, relations, exponents, logarithms, conics, and matrices. The main focus will be on functions and inverses of the following types: linear, quadratic, polynomial, rational, exponential and logarithmic. Students are required to bring a TI-83 or TI-84 graphing calculator to class on a daily basis.

***PLANE GEOMETRY B (6243) 1 Credit**

Open to freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: Algebra I (6143 or 6144) and enrollment in Geometry B within 15 months AND prior to the next course in the sequence within the same discipline.

Throughout this course, an accumulated set of definitions and properties is used to investigate geometric figures. Algebraic competency is expected. In addition, the ability to apply arithmetic and algebraic skills to geometric problems will be emphasized. A strong focus on deductive reasoning and formal proof is also included.

TRIGONOMETRY B (6413) 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: Geometry B and Algebra 2B (grades of B or better)

This class is for students who have completed both Geometry and Algebra II. Topics included in this course are trigonometric functions and their inverses, graphing, solution of right and oblique triangles, trigonometric identities and equations, and applications. This course is offered first semester only. Students are required to bring a TI-83 or TI-84 graphing calculator to class on a daily basis. Only students that earned grades of B or better in Algebra II-B are eligible to take Trigonometry in summer school for advancement.

Academic Courses

Physical Education

DRIVER EDUCATION (9035) 1/4 Credit

Open to freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors

Thirty clock hours of classroom instruction, six clock hours of behind the wheel instruction and fifty hours of parental supervised driving are required by state law. Students may sign up for Driver Education if they are 15 years of age by March 18, 2010. A \$350 driving fee is required. Paying the fee does not guarantee placement in the class.

HEALTH EDUCATION (9033)..... 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores

Prerequisite: none

Health Education is a state mandated one-semester course. Course content will include first aid instruction and the following health topics: mental health, nutrition, fitness, chemical dependency, sex education, death education and diseases.

Science

CHEMISTRY HONORS (8341) 1 Credit

*** 2 SEMESTER COURSE, MUST REGISTER FOR BOTH SESSIONS**

Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: completion of Algebra I-B with grades of B or better for both semesters or Algebra I-A with grades of C or better for both semesters, and completion of one year of Science with grades of B or better for both semesters.

This honors level course provides the basics of chemistry and is recommended for any student who is planning to enter science or a science related field. Using an experimental approach, students will learn to interpret laboratory data and arrive at logical conclusions. During the first semester, a sequential foundation is presented that will be used for the remainder of the course. Topics include the nature and properties of matter, atomic theory, the mole concept, and chemical periodicity. During the second semester, these principles are applied to energy, bonding, and the characteristics of chemical reactions. An examination of qualitative chemistry is also included. It is highly recommended that the student have the equivalent of second year math or be enrolled in such. **Freshmen enrolled in the District's Gifted Science Program may take this course with department head approval.**

PHYSICS HONORS (8441)..... 1 Credit

*** 2 SEMESTER COURSE, MUST REGISTER FOR BOTH SESSIONS**

Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: Completion of Algebra I-B with grades of B or better for both semesters or Algebra I-A with grades of C or better; completion of Geometry B with grades of B or better for each semester or Geometry A with grades of C or better for both semesters; and 2) completion or concurrent enrollment in third year of math.

Physics is the study of the concepts and principles that form the foundation for understanding the physical laws of nature. The student will study these concepts and principles through problem solving and experimentation. The topics covered are measurement, motion, forces, work and energy, electricity, light, and wave properties. This course provides the students with a strong background in the principles involved in the physical world about them. It is recommended for the student who plans to continue in the field of science or technology.

Social Studies

GLOBAL STUDIES (7143)..... 1 Credit

*** 2 SEMESTER COURSE, MUST REGISTER FOR BOTH SESSIONS**

Open to freshmen

Prerequisite: none

Global Studies cannot be taken for honors credit during the summer

Global Studies, a required two-semester course, encompasses the study of World History from prehistory to the 21st Century, including economics, geography and government. This course will emphasize reading, writing and reasoning skills utilizing primary and secondary sources. The course will provide background for further in-depth study in the social studies disciplines.

TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY ISSUES (7236) 1/2 Credit

Open to sophomores

Prerequisite: Global Studies

This is a one semester course where students analyze current issues from an historical, political, economic and geographical perspective. Emphasis will be on the regions of Africa, Middle East, Asia and Latin America. The course is offered during both semesters. This course may only be taken for average credit during summer school.

AVAILABLE SESSION 1 ONLY

PSYCHOLOGY I (7433) 1/2 Credit

Open to juniors and seniors

Prerequisite: none

This one semester elective in Psychology introduces the student to the basic concepts in the study of modern psychology. Topics covered include current trends in psychology as a science, extra-sensory perception, how behavior is conditioned in man and animals, how man learns, important influences on the development of children, theories of personality, mental health and illness. The course emphasizes classroom discussions of current research in the above topics through textbook material and outside readings. Demonstrations, experiments and projects are available, in and out of class, throughout the semester. A student completing Psychology I will be prepared for the material presented in most Introductory Psychology courses at the college level and/or Psychology II - Advanced Studies in Psychology, offered second semester at Barrington High School. This course may only be taken for average credit during summer school.

AVAILABLE SESSION 1 ONLY

U.S. HISTORY (7243) 1 Credit

*** 2 SEMESTER COURSE, MUST REGISTER FOR BOTH SESSIONS**

Open to juniors

Prerequisite: none

This one year course is intended to provide students with a survey of American History from colonization through contemporary America. Students will study the constitution with a required test. Completion of both semesters of this course fulfills the graduation requirement in U.S. History. Materials and expectations will be geared toward students who are about average in terms of reading ability.
